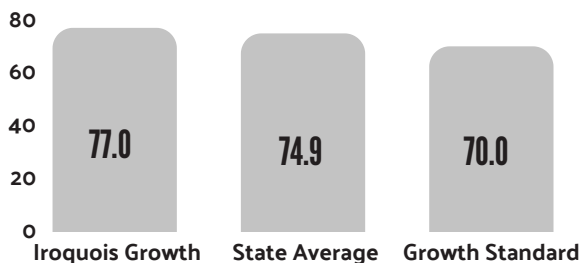
ALL STUDENT GROWTH SCORES

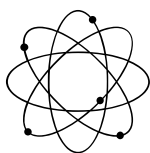

## KEY TO SUCCESS



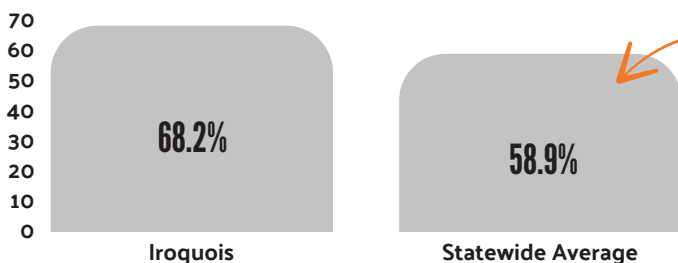

## FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

INCREASED OPPORTUNITIES FOR INVOLVEMENT

In the 23-24 school year, Iroquois:

- experienced a 9 point increase in the percentage of students whose guardians attended parent/teacher conferences
- hosted 61 student, staff and family engagement events
- offered two parent education nights with lead partner Susan Hirt Hagen CORE



### IROQUOIS SUCCESS STORY: SWPBIS LAUNCH



In 23-24, Iroquois implemented a new School-Wide Positive Behavior Intervention and Supports (SWPBIS) framework that saw incredible success. Through a token economy system where students could earn “Bee Tickets” for exhibiting safe, kind and responsible behaviors, Iroquois saw a 63% decrease in office referrals by the end of the school year. Even greater, more than 90% of students had zero discipline referrals in 23-24! Great work, Braves!
