

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

INCREASED FAMILY PARTICIPATION IN SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

In the 23-24 school year, Jefferson:

- saw a 37 point increase in the percentage of students whose guardians attended Parent Teacher Conferences
- hosted its first Family Carnival, which drew over 500 participants from the school community
- hosted 46 student, staff and family engagement events

One of the most memorable moments from the 23-24 school year was Jefferson's partnership with Subaru for **Operation Warm**.
