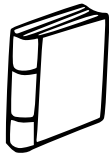
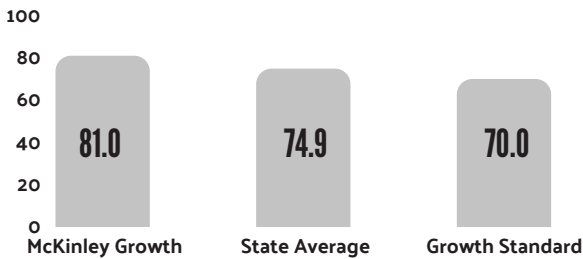

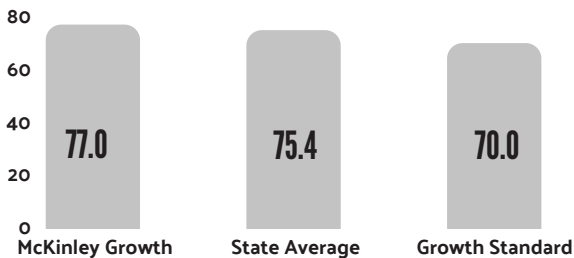
ALL STUDENT GROWTH SCORES

FAMILY ENGAGEMENT

INCREASED OPPORTUNITIES FOR FAMILY PARTICIPATION

In the 23-24 school year, McKinley:

- Hosted 16 family engagement events
- Held a new **Dudes and Donuts** program, where 160 students and their positive male role model, or “dude,” came together for a fun afternoon at school.
- Once again hosted their annual **Color Blast Party**, a neighborhood favorite!



MCKINLEY SUCCESS STORY: THE FAMILY IMPACT TEAM



McKinley created the Family Impact Team to get parents and guardians more involved in decision-making and collaboration at McKinley. Meetings are held 2 to 3 times a year and include school and community partners.

Two new resources were created based on ideas from the team: the **Sharing Shed** and **Family Business Center**. The Sharing Shed has seasonal items like shovels, sidewalk salt, and gardening tools available for families and neighbors. The Family Business Center, launching in the 24-25 school year, will be a designated space in the school library for adults to complete tasks like small printing jobs, scanning or copying items for the doctor’s office, applying for jobs or checking email!

In the 23-24 school year, McKinley was grateful for:

- 194 volunteers contributing over 575 hours of time to events and programs
