

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STUDENT ENRICHMENT

INCREASED ENRICHMENT EXPERIENCES FOR STUDENTS

In the 23-24 school year, Pfeiffer-Burleigh expanded inschool and out-of-school time enrichment programming. As a result:

- <u>every student</u> in grades K-5 had the opportunity to attend a field trip
- over 300 unduplicated students participated in an after-school program
- 12+ community organizations assisted in facilitating 18 after-school programs





PB SUCCESS STORY: STRENGTHENED MENTAL HEALTH PARTNERSHIPS



During the 23-24 school year, Pfeiffer-Burleigh successfully expanded a partnership with UPMC Western Behavioral Health at Safe Harbor with the launch of a tele-health psychiatric clinic. Working within the district's Student Assistance Program, more than 18 students were referred to the clinic and a total of 16 students and families received services. With the addition of the tele-health clinic, Pfeiffer-Burleigh expands their school-based mental health services, which also includes Safe Harbor's Full-Service Community School Case Management Program and Satellite Counseling Services.
